MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION OF FUND PERFORMANCE

Results of Operations

The Fund's net assets increased by 26.7% to \$50.8 million at the end of June 30, 2025, up from \$40.1 million at the end of December 2024.

Investment Performance

For the year/period ending June 30, 2025 (the period), the Educators Money Market Fund – Class A Series provided a return of 1.29% versus the FTSE Canada 91 Day Treasury Bill Index (the Benchmark) return of 1.48%.

The Fund underperformed its Benchmark over the period. Unlike the Benchmark, the Fund's return is net of fees and expenses paid by the Fund. Detailed performance is provided under the heading "Past Performance" in this report. Investors cannot invest in the Benchmark without incurring fees, expenses and commissions which are not reflected in Benchmark returns.

The events of 'Liberation Day ushered in a new era for global trade and caused a great deal of volatility in securities markets. The April 2 announcement introduced a 10% global baseline tariff, alongside higher reciprocal tariffs targeting countries with large trade deficits with the United States. This prompted a sell-off in both risk assets and government bonds on stagflation concerns, which continued until April 9, when the U.S. administration implemented a 90-day moratorium on tariffs for most regions. Although the baseline 10% global tariff was maintained, the pause on more punitive tariffs drove a market reversal, with equities and credit markets rebounding through to the end of the period. Not even the plethora of geopolitical events unfolding in the background, including the bombing of nuclear facilities in Iran in June and a resulting mini oil price shock, managed to temper the rally in risk assets.

Interest rate cuts by the Bank of Canada (BoC) were more muted in the first half of 2025. The BoC cut rates by 0.50% during the period, leaving the overnight rate at 2.75% as of June 30 and no cuts to the overnight rate were made during the second quarter. The overnight rate now sits at the mid-point of the estimated neutral range, well below the restrictive levels seen early in 2024. Given the uncertainty created by tariff messaging from the U.S., the BoC has removed its forward guidance and replaced their baseline scenario with two potential outcomes. At the June 4 meeting, the last before the end of the quarter, the BoC acknowledged they may need to reduce borrowing costs should the economy weaken and inflation remain controlled. However, a recent rebound in core inflation in April has reactivated fears that inflation might be firmer than expected, which would make further rate cuts more difficult to implement.

The Fund kept the weighted average term to maturity in line with that of the Benchmark during the period, as the portfolio adviser expects yields to decrease going forward, locking-in more attractive yields for an extended period. Additionally, the yields on securities with longer maturities have proven sufficient to compensate for the longer

holding period. The Fund ended the period with an average term of 79 days.

The Benchmark ended the period with a yield of 2.60%, down from 3.12% in December 2024, as the result of two interest rate cuts by the BoC. While Bank Deposit Notes and corporate money market instruments continue to yield more than government securities, their yields have also declined on a year-to-date basis, in-line with rates for the overall Canadian short-term market. The Fund continues to invest in non-government securities to generate more attractive yields in the portfolio. As a result of this allocation, the Fund yielded 2.74% as of June 30.

During the period, the Fund performed positively but underperformed its Benchmark. Its allocation to Bank Deposit Notes and corporate money market securities and maintaining an overall duration in line with the Benchmark benefitted the Fund. However, the additional yield garnered from non-government investments was not sufficient to outperform the Benchmark net of fees during this period.

The proportion of government-guaranteed securities within the Fund increased during the period. As of June 30, 2025, the Fund held 18.0% of its investments in Government of Canada and Provincial Treasury Bills, up from 14.1% at the beginning of the year, with the balance held in Bank Deposit Notes and corporate money market securities, which includes bank-sponsored, asset-backed commercial paper.

Recent Developments

Escalating tariff and trade tensions cloud the economic outlook and may intensify inflationary pressures. Secular themes such as deglobalization, protectionism, increased geopolitical conflict, stretched government finances, and a multipolar world, continue to gain momentum.

The portfolio adviser expects interest rates to move lower over the medium-term and will continue to keep the Fund duration in line with that of the Benchmark. This will allow the Fund to continue locking in more attractive yields ahead of any decrease to the overnight rate.

Related Party Transactions

In the first six months of 2025 Educators Financial Group did not refer any conflict of interest matters to the Fund's Independent Review Committee (the IRC) and accordingly did not rely upon any recommendation of the IRC in respect of any related party transactions.

Educators Financial Group is the Manager and Trustee of the Fund. Educators Financial Group is a wholly owned subsidiary of the Ontario Secondary School Teachers' Federation (OSSTF). OSSTF may from time to time invest in units of the Fund.

All references to "Net Assets per Unit" in these financial highlights are references to net assets attributable to holders of redeemable units determined in accordance with IFRS as presented in the financial statements of the Fund.

Net assets and distributions are based on the actual number of units outstanding at the relevant time. The increase/decrease from operations is based on the weighted average number of units outstanding over the financial period. This table is not intended to be a reconciliation of beginning to ending net assets per unit.

Distributions were either paid in cash or reinvested in additional units of the Fund.

Management expense ratio is based on total expenses (excluding [distributions], commissions and other portfolio transaction costs) for the stated period and is expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period.

The management expense ratio before waivers or absorptions shows what the management expense ratio of the Fund would have been if Educators Financial Group had not charged a lesser amount for its management fee.

⁽⁷⁾ The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period.



Management Fees

Educators Financial Group is the Manager-Trustee, promoter, and principal distributor of the Fund, and is responsible for the day-to-day management and administration of the Fund.

The Manager-Trustee monitors and evaluates the performance of the Fund and pays for the investment management services of the portfolio adviser, as well as all administrative services required by the Fund. As compensation for these services, the Manager-Trustee is entitled to receive a fee payable monthly, calculated daily, and based on the Net Asset Value of the Fund, at a maximum annual rate of 0.55% for the Class A Series and 0.30% for the Class F Series. The Class I Series is identical in all respect to the Class A Series, except that there is no management fee payable by the Fund in respect of the Class I units.

The Fund is responsible for paying any applicable tax owing on its management fee.

Approximately 21.0% of the management fees collected from all Series (excluding Class I Series approximately 19.0% of the total management fees collected), were used to pay for portfolio management services, with the remainder of the fees allocated to custodial services, marketing, technology, and Manager-Trustee operating expenses.






Year-by-Year Returns






Annual Returns - Class I Series (1)
